Submit a workshop proposal for the 2011 Andrew Wolf Memorial Conference on **philosophy and food**, taking place on April 22 at American University.

April 22 is **Earth Day** and **Good Friday**, presenting the perfect opportunity to come together and discuss the ways the food we eat and how we eat it shape the world around us.

Workshops will be in the afternoon following a panel discussion, poster session and keynote speech. They can take place inside or outside and should be 30 minutes to an hour long. Workshops should be interactive and translate theoretical work into conscientious practices broadly related to food. Possible topics might include mindful eating, community gardening, animal rights, or labor organizing.

The conference is focused on food as a crucial intersection of **environmental** and **social justice**. As part of the Earth Week activities at AU, this conversation will examine the notion of **sustainability** with a critical philosophical eye: what does this word mean? What do we sustain through sustainable practices, and (why) are these things worth sustaining?

Please include a 1-2 page description of your workshop, a brief bio, and any audiovisual or other materials needed. Proposals are due **March 25<sup>th</sup>**.
